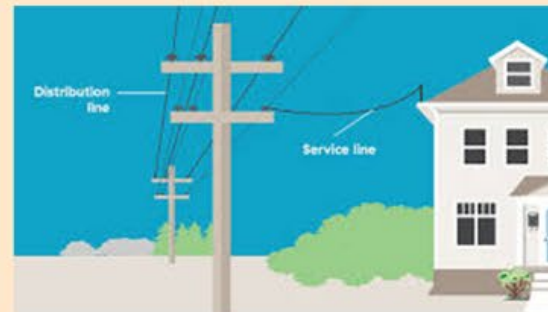
## Distribution Companies
